A letter was then sent to the Mayor and Council and at the next council meeting on Tuesday, September 8th, Heritage King will be recommending the designation to the Council. Only Council can make this decision. Everyone is welcome to attend to show your support of this motion. Meetings begin at 6 p.m. at the Council Chambers in King City.
